We feel it is important to nurture tamariki with care and compassion while understanding the importance of fostering emotional well-being, self-esteem and pride. We provide a familiar and when necessary flexible routine that gives the tamariki a sense of security and belonging.

Our curriculum supports and interweaves a meaningful bi-cultural lens. We believe in nurturing and fostering each tamariki's cultural identity and respect Te Tiriti O Waitangi including Te Reo and tikanga Maori within the bicultural context of Aotearoa New Zealand.
